


Hide and Seek

To play this game with your child, first hide an object. Then, as your child hunts for the object, give hints using words that describe position (i.e., in, out, off, on, under, behind, over, etc.). For example, "Look in the closet and under the teddy bear" or "Look over the couch and on the cabinet." Once your child finds the object, switch roles.



Word Hunt

After the family has finished reading the newspaper, sit down with your child and look for words designating position (in, out, off, on, under, behind, over, etc.). First read a few paragraphs aloud, pointing to and vocally emphasizing the words that describe position as your child looks and listens. Then ask your child to circle the words as you read another few paragraphs aloud. If newspaper print is too small for your child, use magazine advertisements for this activity.
