

Title: Mouse House

Grade: PK-2

Overview: Students use geometric shapes (squares, triangles, circles, half-circles, and rectangles) as they build by following blueprints. With these same shapes, students can also create their own designs. Designs can be printed and colored.

My Learning Objectives:

Identify common geometric objects: circle, triangle, square, rectangle, and half-circle Match shapes

Discriminate between sizes of the same shape

DISCOVER MODE

- 1. Click the House with the mouse in the doorway to enter the Mouse House from the Main Room. The Mouse House contains blueprints, a shape supply area, and a work area.
- 2. Click the Blueprint with the simple house on it to start with a blueprint with squares, circles, rectangles, and triangles in one size. Or click the Blueprint with the fancy house on it to start with a blueprint with squares, circles, rectangles, triangles, and half-circles in two sizes. Or click the empty blueprint to start with an empty work area.
 - If you are following a blueprint, drag the shape from the supply area to the work area and drop it into place (over the same shape).
 - If you are building in the empty work area without a blueprint or adding extra shapes to a blueprint, drag the shapes wherever you want.
- 3. Build as long as you like. Click another blueprint, or build in the empty work area at any time.
- 4. Click the printer to print what you have built. Once printed, you may want to color your design, adding bricks, scenery, people, etc.
- 5. Click the character in the picture frame for the Question and Answer Mode, or click Millie to return to the Main Room.

QUESTION AND ANSWER MODE

- 1. Click the character in the picture frame to enter Question and Answer Mode.
- 2. Frank Lloyd Mouse has surprise blueprints. You will not know what you are building until you finish, but you can decide how many shapes and sizes to use.
- 3. Click the Blueprint with the simple house on it to start with a blueprint with squares, circles, rectangles, and triangles in one size. Or click the Blueprint with the fancy house on it to start with a blueprint with squares, circles, rectangles, triangles, and half-circles in two sizes. Or click the Blueprint with all the shapes on it to start with a blueprint with all shapes in two sizes and the most complex design.
- 4. Mr. Mouse asks you to find a shape.

- 5. Click or drag the shape requested. (To hear the request again, click Mr. Mouse.)6. Click or drag the shape requested. (To hear the request again, click Mr. Mouse.)
 - If you click or drag the correct shape, it snaps into place.
 - If you do not click or drag the correct shape, Mr. Mouse asks you to try again.
- When you finish building, the mice move in and celebrate!

 7. Click the empty picture frame for the Discover Mode, or click Millie to return to the Main Room.
